7. The application will be filed on May 6, 1986 with the Key District Director, Internal Revenue Service at P.O. Box 17010, Baltimore, MD 21203 for an advance determination as to whether the plan meets the qualification requirements of section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, with respect to the plan's initial qualification.
8. The employees eligible to participate under the plan are: All full-time salaried employees engaged in teaching, administration or research who have faculty rank at the college or university, including the president of such institution.
9. The Internal Revenue Service has not previously issued a determination letter with respect to the qualification of this plan.

##### Rights of Interested Parties

10. You have the right to submit to the Key District Director, at the above address, either individually or jointly with other interested parties, your comments as to whether this plan meets the qualification requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

You may, instead, individually or jointly with other interested parties, request the Department of Labor to submit, on your behalf, comments to the Key District Director regarding qualification of the plan. If the Department declines to comment on all or some of the matter you raise, you may, individually, or jointly if your request was made to the Department jointly, submit your comments on these matters directly to the Key District Director.

##### Requests for Comments by the Department of Labor

11. The Department of Labor may not comment on behalf of interested parties unless requested

to do so by the lesser of 10 employees or 10% of the employees who qualify as interested parties. The number of persons needed for the Department to comment with respect to this plan is 10. If you request the Department to comment, your comment must be in writing and must specify the matters upon which comments are requested, and must also include:

- (1) the information contained in items 2 through 4 of this Notice; and
- (2) the number of persons needed for the Department to comment.

#### Comments to the Internal Revenue Service

12. Comments submitted by you to the Key District Director must be in writing and received by him by June 23, 1986. However, if there are matters that you request the Department of Labor to comment upon on your behalf, and the Department declines, you may submit comments on these matters to the Key District Director to be received by him within 15 days from the time the Department notifies you that it will not comment on a particular matter, or by June 23, 1986, whichever is later. (In no event may the request be received later than the 60th day after the application for determination was received.) A request to the Department to comment on your behalf must be received by it by May 21, 1986 if you wish to preserve your right to comment on a matter upon which the Department declines to comment, or by June 2, 1986 if you wish to waive that right.

## COMMITTEE INFORMATION & FACULTY BUSINESS

### Academic & Faculty Affairs Committee

I have attached to this edition of the Chronicle an updated roster of the 86-87 memberships of the 18 Academic and Faculty Affairs Committees listed in the College Handbook. This roster reflects the results of all elections and appointments made to date. Except for the fact that not all committee officers are identified, the roster is complete. Officers for committees (1) through (11) will be known in the very near future, and an updated roster which identifies these officers will be published in next week's Chronicle.

When an entry in the "term expires" column of the attached roster is given in parentheses, it indicates that the incumbent is ineligible for reappointment or reelection to membership on that committee when his present term expires. Mindful of this consideration -- and in an effort to avoid unduly large turnovers in membership in future years -- I have in some cases appointed new members to certain seats on committees where the 85-86 incumbent was eligible for reappointment for 86-88. Similar considerations have applied to the chairmanships of certain appointed committees. To all those who are now vacating either seats or offices on these committees I wish to express my thanks for the fine service you have rendered during your respective terms of membership.

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### Program Review Committee

Some questions have been raised regarding the changes in the criteria for program reviews that were published in the April 18 Chronicle. The criteria used in the previous program reviews were published in the September 13, 1985, Chronicle.

A comparison will show that the old and new criteria are basically the same. Items appear in the same order for easy comparison. The major change is that no attempt will be made to quantify numerically quality or other aspects of the programs. Also, a few items for which data is not usually obtainable such as information on minors have been omitted.

Under the new criteria departments are asked to follow the outline, but the PRC believes more opportunity is provided to include information on aspects of individual programs that are unique or of special importance. The new criteria is intended to be more flexible. It is hoped that this will simplify the process of preparing reports for the PRC.
