The ACLS (American Council of Learned Societies) has announced its programs for 1989-90. The postdoctoral research in the humanities includes:

-- Fellowships (maximum award \$15,000, deadline 9/30/89)

-- Research Fellowship for Recent Ph.Ds. (maximum award \$10,000, deadline 9/30/89)

-- Grants-in-Aid (maximum award \$3,000, deadline 12/15/89)

-- Grants for Travel to International Meetings (\$500-\$1,000, deadline 10/1/89 for meetings January-June 1990, deadline 3/1/89 for meetings July-December 1990)

-- Fellowships for Chinese Studies (\$20,000-\$25,000, deadline 11/15/89)

-- Fellowships for East European Studies (\$10,000-\$25,000, deadline 11/15/89)

The ACLS also sponsors programs with other organizations to support research on foreign areas (Africa, Japan, Korea, Latin America, the Caribbean, The Near and Middle East, Russia, South Asia and Western Europe) and exchanges of scholars to these areas. 
