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Faculty Advisory Committee Report

As was announced by Dr. Summerville at the Faculty meeting, the following memo has been received by FAC relative to the formulation of a Faculty Finance Advisory Committee.

TO: Dr. E. Daly, Chairman, Faculty Advisory Committee

FROM: President Anderson

Subject: Faculty Finance Advisory Committee

I am in receipt of the recommendations of the three Vice Presidents, the Faculty Liaison members to the Board Audit and Financial Affairs Committee, and the Chairman of the FAC which group met in a special meeting held March 7, 1983 anent the captioned subject.

I hereby approve the appointment of an ad hoc Faculty Finance Advisory Committee to report to the Vice Presidents who will act as a three-person committee of the whole. The procedure and functions are as follows:

The FAC or its successor will make nominations of six or more faculty members to the President for the three members. One full-time faculty member from each school will be appointed. The proposed structuring of the academic departments within the three schools shall be utilized for this purpose.

The overall functions of this ad hoc committee are to:

- 1) communicate the viewpoints of the faculty to the Vice Presidents when strategic questions to finance are to be answered;
- 2) discuss relevant financial information with the Vice Presidents;
- 3) advise the Vice Presidents and the Faculty Advisory Committee (or Senate, should that replace the FAC) and act as a linking pin between the Vice Presidents and the faculty on financial matters.

Let me express appreciation to you for the work done in preparation for the creation of this important committee.
