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Safety Films

On Thursday, October 14, 1982, three safety films entitled (1) "Accidents Don't Happen (Safety Supervisor)," (2) "Call 'Em On the Carpet," and (3) "You and Office Safety," will be shown at 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. in room #105 of the Administration Building. These films will be beneficial to all employees of the College, especially supervisors and secretaries.

The film "Accidents Don't Happen (Safety Supervisor)" illustrates the necessity for top management, foremen, bosses, and employees to fully cooperate with the safety supervisor in order to eliminate accident causes. (10 minutes showing time)

The film "Call 'Em On The Carpet," carrying the handling of feelings further, covers the tricky subject of correcting faults without incurring ill will. Humorous, showing there is no cut and dried procedure for bawling a man out. (12 minutes showing time)

The film "You and Office Safety" humorously portrays office accidents. It depicts objects on the floor, file drawers left open, unsafe work practices and lack of planning.

Rhodes Scholarship Trust

This year, for the first time, CNC is participating in the competition for Rhodes Scholarships. The award provides all fees as well as a generous living allowance for at least two years of study at Oxford University.

To be eligible, a student must have been born between October 1, 1958, and October 1, 1964, must be unmarried, and must earn a bachelor's degree by October 1983. Quality of both character and intellect is the most important requirement. A candidate must possess literary and scholastic achievements, a truthful and unselfish character, instincts for and interest in leadership, and physical vigor.

Faculty Advisory Committee Report

1. C.N.C. Catalog Format

The F.A.C. recommended certain changes to the department chairmen relative to the revised format for the C.N.C. catalog as published by B. LaVerrier's office. The Chairman of both schools endorsed the recommendations. Some of the recommendations were accepted. Please see your department chairman for specifics.

2. Meeting with President Anderson and Dr. Summerville

The F.A.C. met with President Anderson and Dr. Summerville on October 1. The agenda included program review, the budget 1983-84, curriculum, College Handbook, and salary.

President Anderson briefed the committee on a plan for faculty compensation under consideration by the SCHEV staff. Both he and Dr. Summerville have registered serious objections to this plan as they feel it would have an adverse effect on salaries here at CNC.

The President reported that he will request additional funding from the Va. Legislature during the short session in January/February 1983. Failure to gain this support would have a significant negative effect on the institution.
