## CNC CAPTURES THIRD PLACE IN EIGHT-TEAM CONFERENCE SAILING MEET

On May 3, CNC participated for the first time in a collegiate sailing meet, competing against teams in the local conference which included CNC, ODC, W&M, Mary Washington College, Washington College in Maryland, and others.

In the A Division, Skipper Craig Loveland and Herb Wornom displayed magnificent ability in drawing one 1st and two 3rds. In the face of extremely tough competition, they edged their opponents in the fifth race and flashed over the finish line in first place. In gaining the two 3rds, Craig and Herb found themselves fortunate enough to cross the finish line somewhat ahead of their nearest competitors.

In the B Division, Skipper Dave Leslie and Wayne Nicholas found the going somewhat more difficult, as they capsized approximately three minutes after leaving the dock. However, after they dried off and discovered that arms and legs do indeed function after immersion in cold water, they exhibited cunning tactical maneuvers (also known as keeping the boat right-side-up) and went on to consistently place 3rd in the regatta.

SUMMARY OF TRACK SEASON

Cross Country - The Cross Country team ended up with an undefeated team this year. The final record was 4 and 0. The team also competed in the Little Eight Meet at Bridgewater and the State Meet in Charlottesville. Lettermen were Gaylon Ryan, Burt Sewell, Bob Morgan, Keith Sinclair, and Harrell Baker.

Indoor - The Indoor Track team competed in two dual meets at Christchurch, a three-way meet at V.M.I. with Bridgewater and Washington and Lee, a triangular meet with O.D.C. and W&M Freshmen, the W&M Invitational, the Richmond Invitational, and the State Meet at Lexington, Va. School records were set by Burt Seawell in 50 yd. dash (5.6), 50 yd. low hurdles (6.1), long jump (21'7"), and triple jump (43'6"); by Gaylon Ryan in the 2 mile (10:32.0); and by Joel Flax in the shot put (39'11").

Greg Donner won the freshman competition for 60 yd. high hurdles at the State Meet.

Outdoor - The Outdoor Track team lost dual meets against the Apprentice School and Chowan. They also competed in the Colonial Relays, State Meet in Richmond, and the Small College Meet in Roanoke. The only school record broken was the javelin by Andy Wachawski with a throw of 169'.
