At 11:00 a.m., Saturday, November 2, he will be present for a question-and-answer session in the Dodge Room of Phi Beta Kappa Memorial Hall.

Mr. Wilbur is a contemporary poet of major stature, winner of both the National Book Award and of the Pulitzer Prize for Poetry. He teaches at Wesleyan University in Connecticut and has recently published poems in The New Yorker and The New York Review of Books.

Christopher Newport faculty and students are cordially invited to attend either or both of these events. There is no admission charge.
