Curriculum Development

On Monday, September 18th, Dr. Ralph J. Vernon, Professor of Industrial Engineering at Texas A&M University, will visit CNC for the purpose of discussing our proposed degree programs in the safety and health fields.

Dr. Vernon, an authority on curriculum development of Occupational Safety and Industrial Hygiene degree programs, is President-Elect of the American Academy of Industrial Hygiene. He will be on campus from 10:00 A.M. until about 2:30 P.M. A working luncheon is planned.

FACULTY NEWS

Fran Slocumb attended a two-week Applied Behavior Science Program at the National Training Laboratories in Bethel, Maine July 17-29. The advanced professional development program focused on generic issues about human behavior, the role of an applied behavioral scientist in dealing with those issues, and the work of changing behavior in human systems.

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Ron Mollick has been elected president of the Board of Directors of Peninsula Planned Parenthood. Ron has been active on the Board for several years and has been Chairman of the Information and Education Committee.

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Denton Beal was elected Vice-chairman of the Board of Trustees of Editorial Projects for Education, Inc., publishers of the Chronicle of Higher Education. He has been a member of the organization since 1960, and served as President and Chairman from 1963 to 1967. Denton will share with Emily Flint, former editor of The Atlantic, and Charles Helinken, director of special projects for CASE, the leadership of a writing workshop for University editors in Atlanta on October 27.

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Dr. Chung-Wu Chang will be speaker at Newport News Public Library System's Fall Lecture Series, September 12, 1978. The topic will be, "Chinese and American Families."

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Dr. Marshall Booker and Mrs. Ralph Booth (Department of Mathematics at Hampton Roads Academy) have been nominated for the Award for Excellence in Private Enterprise Education sponsored by The Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge. Announcement of the winner will be on Washington's birthday, February 22, 1979. The nomination of Professor Booker and Mrs. Booth is for the Business and Economics Summer Institute on Free Enterprise that they devised and sponsored this past summer for twenty-five high school seniors from the Peninsula and which was conducted over a 5 1/2 week period. Approximately \$13,000 to support the institute was raised by Dr. Booker and Mrs. Booth from local business enterprises.
