THE GRANT ADVISOR - published monthly, except July and August. Contains notices concerning pre-doc, post-doc, new-doc, and OLD-doc, private, and federal grants opportunities with summaries, deadlines, and telephonic and/or mail contact listings. This is probably the best general source of grants "farming" that is available in hard copy. Includes notices of items contained in the Federal Register and other documents. (THIS ONE IS ALSO AVAILABLE IN THE PERIODICALS READING ROOM OF THE JOHN SMITH LIBRARY).

NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION BULLETIN - published monthly. Contains NSF program listings, telephone numbers, NAMES, deadlines, organized by NSF divisions. Programs at NSF are "opening up" to the social sciences as well as the physical sciences.

NIH GUIDE - published weekly. Contains detailed listing of opportunities for medical and related research.

FOUNDATION GIVING WATCH and CORPORATE GIVING WATCH - both published monthly. Reports on corporate and foundation support of philanthropic programs and contains up dated listings for foundations and corporations.

TAFT "FOUNDATION REPORTER" and "CORPORATE GIVING DIRECTORY" published annually and purchased at a princely sum. Contains
listings of hundreds of potential sources of gifts and grants,
nationwide, all from private sources. Use these or they will
suffer the outrageous slings of the budget bite.

If you have an idea worth funding, and a little patience, sooner or later we can find a program that will support it. We (that's me and the mouse in my pocket) also maintain file folders of new (and old) program announcements for both major and minor grantors. Most programs renew, each year, so if you just missed a deadline, think about trying next year.


