WHO'S IN CHARGE HERE?

The following statements reflect driver attitudes in areas of responsibility. For each statement, indicate your own reaction by placing a check mark (✓) in the column that best describes your feelings.

1. As the driver of a car, I have the authority to **insist** that all passengers wear safety belts.
2. If a passenger refuses to use safety belts at my request, I am justified in **refusing** to transport that passenger.
3. Passengers riding with me have the **right** to refuse to wear safety belts.
4. If my friend were seriously injured in my car by hitting the windshield, I would **not feel sorry** that I had not required him or her to buckle up.

11. When I am riding in a car, wearing my safety belt is the **most effective, immediate** action I can take to protect myself against the drunk driver.
12. As the driver, I would be **embarrassed** to ask my parents or friends to wear their safety belts.
13. I believe that wearing safety belts should be **required by law** just like child safety seats are.
