Choir Concerts

The Christopher Newport College Concert Choir will present its spring concerts on May 2 in the John W. Gaines Theatre (formerly the Campus Center Theatre) at 8:15 p.m. and on May 3 in the Cradock Baptist Church (Portsmouth, VA) at 4:00 p.m. Both performances are free and open to the public.

Included on the program are the "Coronation Mass" of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and three of the "Coronation Anthems" of George Frederick Handel. The "Coronation Mass" was written in 1779 for a service held annually in Salzburg on the fifth Sunday after Pentecost commemorating the miraculous crowning of an image of the Virgin at Maria-Plain near Salzburg in 1744.

The "Coronation Anthems" were commissioned for the coronation of King George II, which took place on October 11, 1727, in Westminster Abbey. There are four anthems, but English accounts mention only three being performed. It is these three that the CNC Concert Choir will perform.

The Choir of 32 singers is under the direction of Dr. James R. Hines. Accompanist for the group is Ruth Easterling. Soloists for the "Coronation Mass" are Diane Wilson, Karen Earls, Keith Johnson, and Robert Jones; soloist for the "Coronation Anthems" are Janet Miran, Marie Carrithers, David Schmitz, and David King.

Approved Minutes of Curriculum Committee Meeting - April 13, 1987

Dr. Hoaglund presented PHIL 101 and 102, Critical Thinking I and II, to replace the current PHIL 101, Elementary Logic, and PHIL 102, Introduction to Philosophical Inquiry. The Committee approved PHIL 101 since only title change is involved and approved PHIL 102 pending faculty approval.

Dr. Guthrie presented FREN 402, Contemporary French Cinema, taught previously as FREN 395. After discussion the Committee decided to postpone the issue pending further information and possible revision.

Drs. Guthrie and Hines presented MLAN 302, Diction in Foreign Languages, taught previously as MLAN 395. The Committee voted to recommend changes to both departments.
