

OF ACADEMIC INTEREST

Résumé of Group Session Held During Fall, 1977 College Retreat

The workshop on curriculums met with a large number of faculty from many different academic disciplines. As usual, when matters of this sort are seriously discussed by responsible educators, there was not agreement on some basic issues such as definitions of "distribution" and "core" since these terms are sometimes used interchangeably and sometimes used in different ways (e.g., the use of "core" in the BSBA program).

After a great deal of discussion about the kinds of requirements and the amount of time required for some requirements (e.g., 2 courses in some areas vs. the 202 proficiency level in language), a consensus was reached on one matter. In the view of those who attended this workshop, the consensus seemed to be that:

- 1. A distribution should include those courses (or areas) that would be required of all graduates of CNC regardless of the degree. There would be no waivers or variations from these distribution requirements granted routinely.
- 2. Core courses (other than distribution requirements) could be established for students probably by degree; i.e., B.S.B.A., B.S.G.A., MIS, and BS/BA.

3. In addition to these requirements for degrees, each major would continue to specify requirements for students who major in that area.

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Session IV of the general series on "Improving the Psycho-Social Environment of the Elderly in Nursing Homes" to be held on Thursday, October 27, from 2:00 - 3:15 P.M. in Newport 125 may be of interest to faculty and students in the Social and Behavioral Sciences. The speaker, of international professional reputation, will be Dr. Sandra Howell, Associate Professor of Behavioral Science, of the Department of Architecture, Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Dr. Howell will be lecturing on how the therapeutic use of the psycho-social environment of nursing homes and institutions can be used to improve the physical, psychological, and social functioning of the patient.
