

Please include a brief professional vita of your nominee, the possible subject he may speak on, and a brief explanation of the applicability of his subject area to a Dean's Colloquia audience.

Please remember that all presentations must be academic in nature and based on academic research.

These deadlines will not be extended and next year's speakers will be selected by the end of this academic year. All late proposals cannot be accepted or scheduled.
