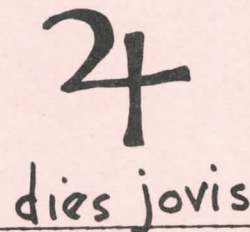

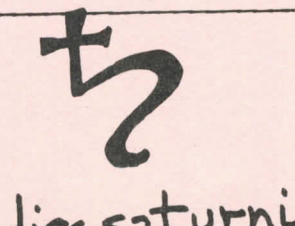

### Counseling Center Seminar

The Organization for Woman's Equality and the CNC Counseling Center are cooperatively sponsoring a seminar, "Women in Transition: From Homemaker to Student." The Seminar will consist of two sessions, first on Wednesday, September 8; the second on Wednesday, September 15. Both sessions will be held at noon in the Campus Center Faculty Dining Room - CC124. Participants are invited to bring their lunch. Coffee and iced tea will be provided. There is no fee for the Seminar itself. Annual membership dues for the Organization for Woman's Equality is \$1.00 and may be paid at the Seminar sessions.

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### Virginia Foundation Workshops

The Virginia Foundation for the Humanities and Public Policy is contributing funds for two symposia in the area. One is a series of "Peninsula Town Hall Meetings" honoring America's Bicentennial; the other is a seminar offered in conjunction with the Hampton-Newport News League of Women Voters and deals with the topic "Behind Chivalry: Why Men Treat Women the Way They Do."

The first Peninsula Town Hall Meeting will take place at Hampton Institute on September 7. At this meeting, Robert Rutland, Editor of the papers of James Madison and a faculty member at the University of Virginia, will talk on the



topic "George Mason--A Virginian With a Vision." The talk begins at 8:00 P.M. Wilma Hunter of the Hampton Institute History staff, a specialist in African American Heritage, will respond to Professor Rutland's address. George Grayson, a member of the House of Delegates and Professor of Government at William and Mary, will be the moderator.

The Behind Chivalry symposium will be held at Christopher Newport College on September 18, 1976. Frank Babcock, Lora Friedman, Bob Wildblood, and Jo-Anne Squires are all participants in the program. The symposium will not focus on the changing roles for women, but will raise such questions as "What Is It Like to Be a Man?" "What Was It Like Growing Up in the Thirties, the Forties, and the Fifties?" "What are the Social Stresses and Pressures on Men Today?" "What Do Men Expect of Women in Their Lives?" and "Why Do Men Vote the Way They Do--Especially in State Legislatures?" Small group discussions will give everyone a chance to voice opinions and to ask questions. The deadline for advanced registration is September 13. Advanced registration fee is \$3.00 (regular registration fee \$4.00) and may be sent to Linda Beebe, Project Director, 112 Long Bridge Road, Hampton, Virginia 23669. Lunch will be provided.
