MEMOS FROM SGA

Hobo Dance - The Hobo Dance, held November 1, proved to be more successful than previous functions of this type. The total ticket sales resulted in \$140.00 -- just \$30.00 short of breaking even.

Film Series - On November 5 and November 7 special films covering the Gemini space flights were shown by the SGA for all interested students. Tuesday's film, "The Four Days of Gemini IV," featured the flight of James McDivitt and Edward White in June of '65. For the first time an astronaut was capable of controlling his movements outside a spaceship by means of a propulsion device. White demonstrated this feat during his 20minute space walk. An endurance record was also set by the two-man space team of 97 hours and 57 minutes, with a distance of 1,906,684 miles covered. On Thursday, the second film, "The Legacy of Gemini," was shown. This film revealed the goals and accomplishments of the United States Space Program as depicted in the twelve Gemini space flights. With a total of 1,940 man hours in space and 600 orbits around the earth, the Gemini program came to a close. The main objective of obtaining flight experience was fulfilled, thus paving the way for the Apollo space shots which give promise of sending a man to the moon in 1969.

These films were the first in a continuing series of free films to be presented by the SGA.

New Ruling - Due to a vacancy in the presidential slot of the freshman class, another election for the office of freshman vice-president must be held.

On November 5, the Executive Council of the SGA met to discuss the problem of the vacancy and to consult the constitution as to rules of succession. However, the Council found no definite rules for official succession contained in the constitution except for one guideline found under Article Four, Section 6. It states that "the election and duties of all class officers shall be described in the Student Government Manual." Since the Executive Council is responsible for compilation and publication of the Student Government Manual, these rules of succession were decided upon:

- a. If, at any time, the office of president shall become vacant, the vice-president shall succeed that office.
- b. Re-election of the vice-presidential office must occur if the vice-president succeeds the presidential office during the first semester. There will be no re-election if a vacancy occurs during the second semester as elections for the ensuing year occur at that time.

Christmas Dance - Final plans for the Christmas Formal have been completed. The dance will be held on Sunday, December 22, at the Original Club. It will begin at 9:00 p.m. and last until 1:00 a.m. The coronation of Miss CNC will be the first event of the evening, and she and her escort will initiate the ball. Therefore, we suggest that everyone arrive as early as possible. The music will be furnished by Charlie McClendon and the Magnificents. Dress is either formal or semi-formal. There will be no banquet. Tickets are \$5.00 per couple.

Bonfire - A bonfire prior to the basketball game on November 30 is being planned.
