

### Substance Abuse Awareness Seminars

The Virginia Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators (VACLEA) is conducting two seminars to acquaint resident life staff on Virginia college campuses with problems associated with substance abuse. The seminars are designed for resident advisors, resident assistants, counselors, and others on campuses who are in the position to detect and prevent student substance abuse. Primary emphasis will be given to problems associated with drug abuse.

The purpose of the seminars is to assist resident life staff and others to:

- recognize various drugs

- recognize symptoms and behavior associated with the drug use
- understand the extent and nature of drug problems on campuses
- recognize opportunities for detecting and preventing substance abuse

- understand the destructive nature of substance abuse and the need for intervention.

VACLEA is offering the first seminar at the Days Inn in Charlottesville, November 10-11, 1988. The second seminar is scheduled November 17-18, 1988, at the George Washington Inn in Williamsburg.

A \$10.00 non-refundable registration fee includes two lunches, refreshment breaks, and materials. Interested persons should contact the Campus Police Office for further details.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### Student Affairs Committee

Chuck Behymer, VPSA, reported that the Athletic Department had two new coaches: Kathy Parson, women's basketball coach and assistant athletic director and Craig Reynolds, men's soccer and men's tennis coach. In addition, it was reported that the dormitory committee has invited architectural firms to submit plans as well as bids for the dormitory project. Construction of the dormitory project will be on a phased basis.

Keith McLoughland, Dean of Admissions and Records, reported that head count enrollment was up 5.35% over 1987, FTE enrollment up 12.33%, freshman enrollment up 27.78% and transfers up 14.01%. In addition, it was reported that CNC's black student enrollment was up 10.69% over 1987 and our honor's program enrollment had increased. It was also reported that the major contributing factor to the above increases was due to the Board of Visitor's decision to fix the cost above twelve credit hours.
