

Approved Minutes of Curriculum Committee Meeting - October 22, 1986

Drs. Brockett, Hines and Hubbard presented MUSC 201G - 202G for discussion and requested that the new course be listed as 207G - 208G in order to retain the traditional 201-202. After a lengthy discussion the Committee decided to postpone the issue pending further investigation and discussion.

Dr. Paul presented new ENGL 450 to replace the current Topics Course on advanced writing. The Committee voted to accept the new course, pending approval of Dean Powell.

General Education Structural Sequence: Alexander, Cheney and Powell.
