

COMMITTEE INFORMATION & FACULTY BUSINESS

Report from Committee on Development and College Relations

The committee received a financial report from Barry Wood, Director of Development. This report revealed that Christopher Newport College and its foundation has received gifts totaling \$152,664.16. In addition the Director of Development informed the committee that his conversation with Gordon Davies of the State Council of Higher Education, revealed three possible outside consulting firms to be considered in a comprehensive marketing analysis for Christopher Newport College. The consulting firms listed were AVA Education Policy/Planning Services of Denver, Colorado, Barton Gillet Co., of Baltimore, Maryland, and SRI Gallop College Marketing Research of Lincoln, Nebraska. It was emphasized that this marketing research study would be conducted in the spirit of obtaining for the college a better focus of endowment, admissions and retention. Paula Delo, Director of Public Relations, reported on efforts by Don Loepp, reporter for the Times Herald, and Myrtle Barnes, Managing Editor of the Daily Press/Times Herald, to raise the community's awareness of activities, functions and faculty at Christopher Newport. The Director of Public Relations also reported that only three departments on the campus responded to her inquiries of meeting informally with Don Loepp.

Bev Vaughan, Director of Athletics, reported on the work of the Athletic Advisory Committee in their five year plan to assess needs for facilities, equipment, personnel and sport activities. He also reported on a NCAA National Survey being conducted at CNC to gain demographic data on athletes, time spent in practice sessions and time missed from regular academic classes. It was recommended by Gordon Gentry, Chairman of the Committee of Development and Community Relations that Mr. Vaughan look into the formation of a "think tank" of former national athletes on how CNC's athletic program can be further integrated into our community.
