Payroll Bonds Payroll bond customers, because legislation to raise the debt limit has not been enacted into law, the issuance of Series EE bonds has been suspended effective November 1, until further notice.

Since we issue bonds for employees of your company who participate in the payroll bond program, we are informing you of a potential delay in issues for the month of November. This temporary delay will not

cause loss to purchasers since bonds will earn interest from the first day of the month in which the funds are made available to us.

Companies operating payroll savings plans should continue withholding on a regular basis and continue to submit funds and bond print information to us a normal.

We regret any inconvenience your company and employees may experience as a result of delayed action by Congress to raise the statutory debt limit. (Fiscal Agency Dept., Federal Reserve Bank)
