Curriculum

In its meeting of April 20, 1990, the Senate approved the following changes to the subject requirements as delineated on pages 46-47 of the 1989-90 Catalog:

AREA I ADD:

Foreign Language (6 semester hours required)
French, German, Japanese, Latin or Spanish 101-102
This requirement will be satisfied by a student having completed 3 years of a foreign language in high school or if the student has an acceptable score on a placement test offered by the Department of Modern and Classical Languages and Literature.

AREA III Change " 4 Semester Hours Required " to " 2 Semester Hours Required" Delete sentence that begins "Either two...and substitute "Students should take one LSPE activities course or Health 200".

AREA IV Part (3) Delete "French, German, Japanese or Span 101, 102, 201, 202" and substitute "French, German, Japanese, Latin, or Spanish 201 or 202".
