The Feb. issue of <u>The Journal of Luminescence</u> contains an article by Guzin Armagon and Martin Buoncristiani in the Physics Dept. on "Energy Transfer and Thermalization in YAG:TM.Ho." This article reports, for the first time, evidence of a process-long thought to occur in such materials.

Drs. Sang O.
