

Dixie suspends player for illegal bat

Alex Vasquez was suspended for two games earlier in the season because of an illegally corked bat. Vasquez ordered the bat in the off-season to give him an advantage the following year. Head coach Curt Long was infuriated at the decision, but his appeals have gone unheard. He now looks jovially on the situation.

"We use aluminum bats, " said Long.
"It actually makes the bat heavier to put
cork in it. I don't know what he was thinking."

Averett head coach, Abe Naff, knew something was unusual about the bat when he dropped it on the foot of Averett catcher, Biff Summersby. Naff called for an inspection and, after a two hour delay while maintenance workers cut it open with a blow torch, found the illegal substance. Vasquez was ejected from the game.

When asked why he suspended the youngster Dixie Conference Chairman, Ted Kennedy said, "Hey, if you can't do it in the majors, you can't do it here."

"I almost go away with it," added Vasquez. "If I hadn't dropped it, there wouldn't have been a problem.

On a positive note, Vasquez has amazingly improved his numbers since he returning to the team and going back to his old bat. With the corked bat he hit 198 with 15 strikeouts. In the four games since his suspension he has hit for an average of .798 with six home-runs, two doubles, a triple, and no strikeouts.

"All the other bats feel like feathers, "
said Vasquez. "I think I've built up my
strength and bat speed by using the corked
bat for the first eight games of the season.
I also practiced with it for six months in
the off-season."

"He can really get around on the ball, now, "added Long. "He could barely carry the thing before. We were thinking about cutting him from the team."

Since the incident, the makers of the illegal bat have been flocked with orders from all over the country.

Ratcliff Gym, built in 1647, has a seating capacity of about 500, but a strange phenomenon called outdatedfossilizedfacilitysis may reduce that number by 50 as early as the start of the next basketball season.

"We have experimental age reducers in place to slow the process," said building maintenance worker, Moses, who began his career here the year Ratcliff was built. "I remember when we first laid the plans for the structure right after that golden calf incident. She's a fine building and we hate to see her go like this."

"I could have sworn there was more


"I could have sworn there was more room there earlier," said the unidentified junior from West Point, VA. who is going bald and answers to "Bubba."

The hospital refuses to accept blame reporting only that he should not have been on that floor without a hoagie.


"I thought he was a patient," said an intern who offered to speak on anonymity. "How was I supposed to know he was just a skinny runt who thinks he's an athlete?"
