

Concerning the foreign language department's proposal to require a 6 hour, 2 semester course for all CNC students, I call your attention to the following sentence from the winter "Newsletter" of the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages:

In a survey conducted last July for the 1987-88 academic year,

the MLA (Modern Language Association of America) found that of the 1,482 participating baccalaureate institutions, ... 52.8% had a foreign language requirement for graduation. (p.11)

I should also like to call to your attention that the School of Engineering at ODU has just recently submitted a proposal to the Department of Foreign Languages for a combined degree in "Engineering/German."

The deadline for all submissions to the chairman is Friday, April 14, 1989. Selectees will be notified soon thereafter.
