A fter three years of fundraising and hard campaigning the national leadership honor society, Omicron Delta Kappa will open a new circle on the CNU campus later this month. Faculty advisor and professor of English Dr. Doug Gordon said, "There is no other national honor society other than Phi Beta Kappa that is so highly recognized in American colleges and universities. It also gives high distinction to thestudents of our university by a national honor society."

The national leadership honor society, founded on December 3, 1914 at Washington & Lee University in Lexington, Virginia, will present a formal charter to Christopher Newport University in the Campus Center, Room 150 on Friday, March 29 at 7 p.m.
