Faculty Activities -- Cheryl Mathews, Director of Social Work, was recently elected to a two year term as President of the Virginia Social Work Education Consortium (VSWEC). Cheryl was an organizing member of VSWEC in 1986, has served as the group's Secretary/Treasurer and was honored by the consortium with the 1991 "Outstanding Social Work Educator Award".

Faculty Activities -- Dr. Yvonne Stringfield, from the Department of Nursing, has written a third book review for and published by Nursing and Health Care, the official publication of the National League for Nursing. The book she reviewed was Introduction to Critical Care Nursing. Dr. Stringfield also presented a paper entitled, "The African American Experience in Health Care" at the 2nd annual National Association of African American Studies Conference at Virginia State University on February 16. These changes are being made in order to protect the people who are able to use this facility. Please pass the word that Ratcliffe Gymnasium is **OPEN ONLY TO CNU FACULTY, STAFF AND STUDENTS WITH A VALID AND CURRENT CNU ID.** This program is being implemented after a survey of other state colleges and universities.

Effective Wednesday March 30th, — after 6:00 PM, — all individuals that use the facilities in Ratcliffe Gymnasium must present a **CNU ID CARD WITH A CURRENT SPRING 1994 STICKER** upon entering. Please use the front door that leads into the hallway where the classrooms are located. When an individual has completed their workout, their ID card will be returned as they leave the facility.
