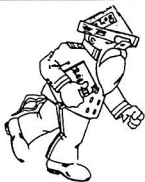

CNU Hosts "Debt-Benefit-95" Concert

An all-star fundraiser was held last Wednesday, to raise money to pay off the school's debt. The John W. Gaines theatre was the host of the biggest rock concert since the 70's. ACT ONE brought in the talent for this fantastic show.

Opening up for "Debt-Benefit-95" was Jimi Hendrix, performing acoustic versions of "Purple Haze," and "The Wind Cries Mary," and he delivered a short speech on how to invest money. Following Hendrix's act, Jim Morrison delivered a rare solo performance singing "Break On Through" and "Light my fire." Morrison really got the house rockin' and received a standing ovation. After Morrison, departed, there was a brief intermission for the next act to set up.

Before the curtain rose, the music started and the audience was surprised to hear the

Steve Winwood's band, "Traffic" followed "the Fab Four" and played some old favorites. "Traffic's" performance got a green light from the audience to keep on "truckin'," and campus police couldn't stop it.

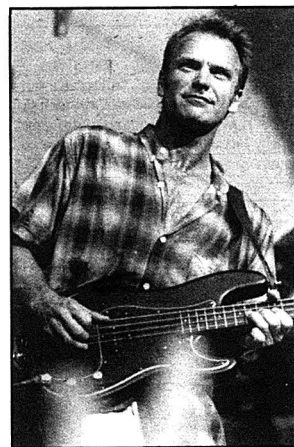
The two Bobs—Bob Marley and Bob

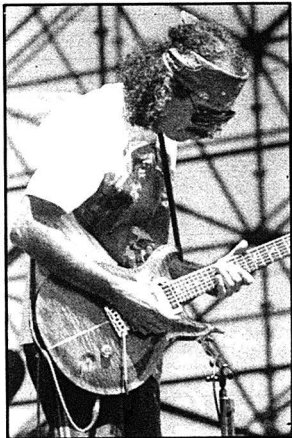
For the finale, The Grateful Dead brought their world-embracing music to the theatre. Jerry Garcia, Mickey Hart and Robert Weir were fantastic, along with the rest of the band which included guest appearances by Sting, Bob Dylan, Carlos Santana, Winton Marsalis and Bruce Hornsby. Their finale included a one-hour space jam, with Hart shakin' the house on "the Beam," and the Dead closed the show

with "St. Stephen."

A record-setting crowd of six students showed up to hear this event. Acting Director of Student Life Marie Hawley said that she was very impressed with the showing. "We've had a lot of events this year where nobody at all has shown up. For a group of six students to attend this jam session was truly impressive!" The show raised \$12. Since the president couldn't accept the money to pay off the debt, the money was immediately transferred to pay for the new smoking lounge which will be built around the senior gift fountain (which will be turned into a giant ashtray). Anyone who missed this show lost out. It was the concert of the century and it all happened at CNU.

Presidents Step Out On University

CNU Vice President William Brauer and SGA President Jon Burgess are in police custody now, after a harrowing chase across campus.

Campus police found Brauer's briefcase filled with over \$700,000 and two tickets to Bolivia. Jon Burgess' duffle bag held what police described as "marital aides."

Campus policeman Samuel Warren Jr. was on the scene. "Darndest thing I've ever seen. 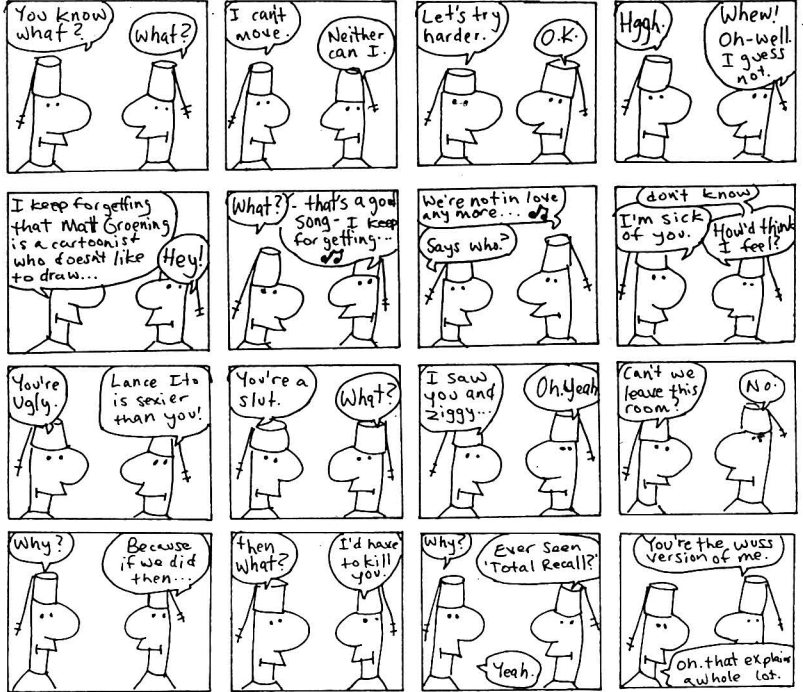

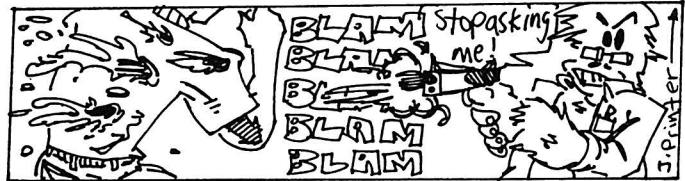
