

aduate Follow-Up Survey

The Office of Career Planning and Placement will administer a Graduate Follow-Up Survey of the 1987 graduates in April. The primary purpose of the instrument is to ascertain key areas of graduate outcome data to include: 1) graduate school information - who is going to graduate school, where, and for what programs of study, 2) employment information - who is employed, occupational title, employer and location, who is unemployed, if unemployed, why, and 3) additional information - level of graduate involvement in community, civic, political and other activities, level of satisfaction with educational experience at CNC, and a section for additional comments. This information will be of great value to many areas and will support the assessment model of the College.

The survey instrument was developed through a collaborative effort with the deans, several faculty, the Assessment Committee, student affairs offices, Career Planning and Placement and Student Development and the Alumni Office. The Office of Career Planning and Placement plans to administer the survey on a yearly basis. Final reports will be forwarded to all vice presidents, deans and department heads.
