Faculty Activity -- Douglas Gordon's review of "Traveling the High Way Home: Ralph Stanley and the World of Traditional Bluegrass" appears in the September issue of Choice, published by the American Library Association. In addition, Dr. Gordon's paper, "Canine Guardians and Marauders at the Threshold of Change: Savagery and Sacrifice in a Decade of Film Dogs, 1984-1994" has been accepted by the Twentieth Annual Conference on Literature and Film at Florida State University in January.

Hudgins Contracting is set to begin construction on the north campus parking lot and loop road. This project will add 200 new parking spaces, 14 handicapped spaces, sidewalks and lighting to the north-side of campus.
