The major benefit to Christopher Newport will be an expected increase in students entering at the upper-level in all programs involved. It is our intention to continue negotiations for additional programs in the coming months.

The Articulation Committee wishes to thank all department chairmen who were involved in the construction of those agreements, as well as Deans King and Summerville who assisted us greatly.

Copies of the actual agreements (course-by-course) have been delivered to each department.

#### Middle East Expert at CNC Monday Noon

At noon on Monday, March 29th, in the Campus Center Theater, Dr. Joseph J. Malone from Washington, D.C. will speak on "Security Concerns in the Arabian Peninsula: Arab and American Perspectives." All CNC faculty, staff and students are invited as is the general public.

Dr. Malone is president of Middle East Research Associates, Inc., and is involved in consulting on technology transfer to the Middle East of aerospace, telecommunications, and educational television as well as adapting and translating English-language scientific books and journals into Arabic.

Dr. Malone earned his doctorate in modern history at the University of London in 1956. He has taught in Morocco, Libya, Saudi Arabia, Ethiopia and Lebanon as well as in the United States. From 1959 to 1971 he was chairman of the Department of History at the American University of Beirut. In 1975 he became Director for three years of Middle Eastern Studies at the National War College, in which capacity he led delegations to the Middle East, and had meetings with the Shah of Iran, King Khalid and Emir Fahd of Saudi Arabia, and the late President Sadat of Egypt.

Dr. Malone is an editor of Muslim World and the Journal of South Asian and Middle Eastern Studies. He is the author of several books including among others: The Arab Lands of Western Asia (Prentice-Hall, 1973), and The Shaping of the Arab World (The Aspen Institute for Humanistic Studies, 1978), and has authored numerous articles on the Middle East.

#### Degrees Committee

As dates for registration approach, the faculty may be interested in the following stipulation which will appear in the new college <u>Catalog</u>. The statement can be considered as a sub-heading of item #5 in column two of p. 35 in the present <u>Catalog</u>:

No more than 60% of the minimum credits required (usually 124) toward a degree may come from courses in the School of Business and Economics.

Also, in an effort to clear up a serious ambiguity, the VPAA has approved the revision of the present p. 172 so that the following will be considered "major fields":

Accounting (B.S.); Economics (B.A.); Accounting (B.S.B.A.); Economics (B.S.B.A.); Finance (B.S.B.A.); Management (B.S.B.A.); Marketing (B.S.B.A.); Real Estate (B.S.B.A.); International Culture and Commerce (B.A.)

In other words, horizontal lines will be drawn under each program presently listed on p. 175.
