If you have ever entertained questions about the response of students on the USES survey -- questions such as, "Do students vary in their responses as a function of the grades they believe they are going to get?" or, "Which questions on the survey are the most similar to others in terms of the responses they elicit from students?" -- then you may want to take advantage of a special offer. Working cooperatively with the Computer Center staff, I will make available to each faculty member who requests it several analyses of past USES evaluation data which pertain to his or her courses. These include crosstabulations between overall performance ratings and all other questions on the survey, correlations among all the questions, and the extraction of factors or meaningful clusters of questions. Depending on the number of requests received, I will also meet with faculty members, either individually or in groups, to answer specific questions and help to interpret the statistical summaries generated.
