Dean's Colloquia Presentation The Dean William Parks Memorial Colloquia Series is pleased to announce its fifth program of the year. On Monday, March 5, at noon in A-105 Dr. Theodora Bostick will present a paper to the college community.

Dr. Bostick, Professor of History and chairman of the History Department, has entitled her paper "He-Women and She-Men: A Profile of the Early Suffragists." It deals with the women's suffrage movement in nineteenth-century and its challenge to the societal norms of the time.

D e a n 's Colloquia Call for Papers and Nominations The Dean William Parks Memorial Colloquia Committee is hereby issuing a call for papers and nominations for the 1990-91 Colloquia Series.

The series consists of formal presentations of papers of an academic nature based on original research and suitable for a general college audience. Five programs are normally scheduled each academic year, one by an outside guest and four by CNC faculty members.

Nominations for an outside speaker should include a brief resume of the nominee and a clear indication as to the subject he or she would likely address.

Proposals from CNC faculty members should include a precis of the paper to be presented. An honorarium of \$500 is extended to each faculty member chosen to give a paper as part of the series.

All nominations and proposals must be received by the chairman by <u>Friday</u>, <u>April 13</u>. No nominations or proposals will be considered after that date. The committee will announce its decisions before the end of the academic year.
