### OF ACADEMIC INTEREST

ATTENTION ACADEMIC ADVISERS: Detective Fiction will be taught as a special topics course (English 395) by Dr. Steve Sanderlin during the spring semester at 11 A.M., MWF.

Though Detective Fiction will, as an upper-level English course, count towards the major or minor in English, it will be taught so as to enlighten and entertain all interested students who have had at least one semester of sophomore literature either at CNC or elsewhere.

Students will read and discuss popular stories of Agatha Christie (Hercule Poirot and Miss Jane Marple), Sir A. Conan Doyle (Sherlock Holmes), S. S. Van Dine (Philo Vance), Ellery Queen, Dorothy L. Sayers (Lord Peter Wimsey), and representatives of the contemporary "violent" school of detective fiction. In addition, at least six full-length murder-mystery films will be shown as part of the course.

The course is recommended to English majors and minors as part of their program and to other students as a three-credit, upper-level English course of general interest.

### FACULTY-LIBRARY COORDINATORS MEETING

The Faculty-Library Coordinators met with Bette Mosteller on November 9th to review requests for new periodical subscriptions. In making their evaluations of the requests, the Coordinators consulted a survey of periodical use prepared by the library staff, Evan Farber's Classified List of Periodicals for the College Library, and other periodical directories. They also reviewed the periodicals subscribed to presently by each department and made cost comparisons. Of the eleven new periodical requests made, nine were approved and two returned to their requestors with the suggestion that they be resubmitted at a later date if they were still deemed necessary.
